This same young population will





International design competition mooted for Jeddah

The Land Art Generator Initiative (LAGI) for public art in renewable energy infrastructure is considering a third international design competition focusing on the historic core of Jeddah, Al-Balad.

LAGI seeks to engage artists, architects and designers in the development of renewable energy infrastructure as objects of city beautification. Following the first competition, which was sponsored by Masdar and focused on sites

at Abu Dhabi's Yas and Saadiyat Islands and Dubai's Ras Al Khor, the current design competition for New York's Freshkills Park received 250 submissions from creative minds out of 39 countries.

Co-founder Robert Ferry, who is speaking at the Architectural Design Days Jeddah conference on 10 October, is excited to present how Jeddah can benefit from an adapted design competition for Al-Balad.

Tapping into an international and regional pool of creativity within Saudi defined guidelines allows new cultural

and economic impulses for Jeddah, he argued.

Frey said: "The talk will provide an overview on the background of the initiative in the context of eco-art history, urban planning and the carbon-neutral movement, with particular attention on the notion of positive impact' construction.

"Both the 2010 LAGI competition for the UAE and the 2012 competition in New York City will be highlighted. The potential for LAGI to create proposals for the Al-Balad area of Jeddah will be also be presented."
